"Whatever affects one directly, affects all indirectly."*

Fifty years after the assassination of Dr. King, the long struggle for civil rights continues. Dr. King taught us to recognize the long arc of history <u>and</u> "the fierce urgency of now!"

"This is the time for vigorous and positive action," he said. "We must demonstrate, teach and preach until the very foundations of our nation are shaken."

IMPORTANT ELECTIONS IN 2018

Elections in 2018 are crucial — and may be confusing. Help educate voters!

- ◆ Court battles continue over the district maps used for <u>some</u> N.C. legislative elections. Voters need to be prepared for changes.
- ◆ Legislators may put confusing questions on the ballot, such as asking voters to approve replacing judicial elections with appointments

or add a voter ID rule to the N.C. Constitution.

◆ There's no U.S. Senate or high profile race on the ballot. But this is the year to elect state legislators, county commissioners, sheriffs, judges, DAs. See inside: Justice is on the ballot!



2018: Justice is on the Ballot!

County sheriffs, district attorneys, and local judges are on the ballot this year. Want them to treat you right? Do you want officials who do the right thing for justice? Now's your chance to vote them in or vote them out! Justice is on the ballot.

You can also elect a N.C. Supreme Court justice this year and Court of Appeals judges.

Assembly want to <u>replace elections</u> of judges with a process that lets legislators essentially <u>appoint</u> their friends as judges. That would require voters to approve an amendment to the N.C. Constitution, so **be prepared for a ballot question about judges.**They may call it "merit selection," but look closely!

The General Assembly is changing other parts of the justice system. One proposal (House Bill 717) redraws the district lines for local judges to make it harder for Black and women judges to be elected.

What should we resolve to do in 2018?

Take your commitment to Justice to the ballot box this year. All elections matter, but a smaller number of people vote in an off-year like 2018. That means you can have a big impact with a well-focused voter education and turnout effort. All state legislators are up for election in 2018; it's time to hold them accountable! Justice officials are on the ballot, too – sheriffs, DAs, and judges. It's a Justice Election. Pass it on!
