


WHAT'S ON THE PRIMARY BALLOT IN 2022?

All North Carolinians are affected by the decisions made by these elected officials.


STATE JUDGES AND JUSTICES:

N.C. COURT OF APPEALS AND SUPREME COURT

The state's highest courts hold the governor and legislature accountable. They make big decisions on issues from redistricting to death penalty appeals. They are the final word on what is "constitutional" and other interpretations of state laws.

STATE LEGISLATURE: N.C. SENATE AND N.C. HOUSE

The two chambers of the N.C. General Assembly hold the power to draft state laws on anything they choose. They can enact criminal justice reform, draw our voting maps, and decide how North Carolinians receive health care. They also use our taxpayer dollars to set the state budget, including resources for everything from roads to schools.

CONGRESS: U.S. SENATE AND U.S. HOUSE

With the ability to make U.S. law and oversee federal agencies, congressional powers include spending our tax dollars, taking the country to war, deciding who gets healthcare and environmental protections, and when to hold the president accountable – from appointments to impeachments.



POLICE TRANSPARENCY & ACCOUNTABILITY IS ON THE BALLOT

U.S. congresspeople create laws that impact our criminal justice system, N.C. legislators are responsible for defining state crimes. Judges at all levels rule on the cases we see in the news almost every day, including deciding whether police are held accountable for the murders they commit. Our safety is at stake this year.



FACT

Over 5.5 million North Carolinians cast a ballot during the 2020 General Election – nearly 72% of the state’s voting population, and the highest turnout in history. Let’s keep up that momentum and get all of our friends and family to vote with us!



PUBLIC EDUCATION IS ON THE BALLOT

Across the country, state legislatures are passing laws to limit or ban our teachers from teaching our children about racism, while local school boards are voting to ban certain books from the classroom. Teaching our children our history is at stake this year.



FACT

Voting in a Primary is a little different. If you are registered as a Democrat or Republican, you will receive that ballot to vote. If you are registered as Unaffiliated or with the Green or Constitution Parties, you will be asked to choose between a Democrat or Republican ballot when you vote.
